Purpose:		It was developed to measure activities of daily living (ADL) independence in both adults and children and others measure function (bladder/bowel emptying and incontinence, chewing/swallowing food and liquids, verbalizing telephone messages). Items are divided into six sub-dimensions: Mobility, Emergency Communication, Dressing, Elimination, Bathing/Hygiene, and Eating.
